LIBRARY SERVICES

PARKING ENTRANCE (UNDERGROUND CARPARK)

Open 24hrs a day, Prahran Square has 500 underground car spaces across two underground levels. Access is located via. Izett Street

9 BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT LOUNGE

Community facility to support and develop local businesses including opportunities for appointments in mentoring, coaching and consultation for businesses and traders.

THE HUB (LOWER GROUND FLOOR)

A new and flexible space to engage and interact with residents, visitors and businesses, offering the opportunity to provide Council services, visitor information and receive feedback from the community.

CHANGING PLACES FACILITY (LOWER GROUND FLOOR)

Changing Places are larger than standard accessible toilets with adult-sized change tables and tracking hoists.

At the thresholds to Prahran Square, The Pipes is an invitation to experience an expansive clearing. Composing light, movement and environmental sounds into an atmosphere of call and response, the work creates a new space of belonging. A site-specific visual and audio installation co-designed by Ramus and Material Thinking, in collaboration with Lyons Architects.

•• 'RING FORM 1&2 by' Jamie North

Ringform 1 and 2 are 'living' sculptures, which represent the artist's deep interest in the intersection of the natural world and the man-made. The architectural rings have firstly been embedded with materials that the artist has sourced from industrial sites, and then softened by the cultivation and integration of Australian native plants, which continue to grow and evolve over time.

'MURNALONG' by Fiona Foley

murnalong celebrates bees for their significance in our global ecosystem. Its title 'murnalong' is a local Indigenous Boon Wurrung word meaning bee. Throughout her practice the artist highlights commonalities across cultures. Historically an important food source for Indigenous Australians, bees remain crucially important to our shared future.
